- ♦ increase the awareness of public librarians and others about public library support and initiatives for older adults now occurring internationally and in Australia and New Zealand.
- ♦ increase political awareness of the community's return on investment in public libraries able to engage and support well the growing number and diversity of active and other older adults.

Conference overview

Like public libraries in other developed countries, public libraries in Australia and New Zealand are uniquely placed to help mediate the social transformation occurring because of their growing number and proportion of older adults. These adults are resources for our communities and our libraries – if public libraries can provide the opportunities and connections to support their lifelong learning, civic participation and life quality.

Countries such as the US and UK have been developing strategic responses to the library needs of older adults but a national focus and investment in it has yet to happen in Australia and New Zealand.

Next chapters aims to be seminal in changing this, and making it a priority in the funding, strategic planning and partnerships of all public libraries.

Keynote speakers **Stacey Aldrich** (Deputy State Librarian of California) and **Margaret Sloan** (The Network UK) will bring to the conference their wealth of experience and knowledge of what is occurring in engaging and supporting older adults in their countries. They will be supported by Australian and New Zealand speakers covering a wide range of issues and initiatives for all public librarians to consider in developing their services for older adults, from the baby boomers onwards.

The speakers will respond to *your* questions in two panel sessions, one on each day of the conference. At the end of the conference recommendations will be considered, including recommendations to increase political awareness of what public libraries can contribute to successful and inclusive ageing policies in Australia and New Zealand.
